The Objectof the study in your hands aims to identify the main causes of the spread of sports corruption in football as well as the mechanisms of combating sports corruption in football, and to present the reality of football in Algeria from the point of view of specialists and to identify the importance of the use of educational means in the field of physical and sports education and for that we followed the descriptive survey method, where the sample of the study reached 49 university professors from the Institute of Physical Education and Sports In Dali Brahim University of Jar3 er and selected in a deliberate way, and The researcher methods statistical correlation coefficient for Pearson, spss and Excel. The most important results of the study were that the administration, players and their coaches are among the main causes of the spread of sports corruption, as some of them can settle the results of the game or seize the rights of some, and that the spread of the phenomenon of corruption in football has many hidden factors.



1. Introduction

Corruption is one of the oldest phenomena that has emerged, and its existence has been associated with the existence of political systems. There is no doubt that this epidemic, in all its forms, and its various forms have spread to all countries of the world, as it has become a serious global phenomenon that threatens the economies of states and works to weaken and collapse, as well as frustrate their financial systems and political structure, which negatively affects moral values, justice and equality and leads to the destabilization of public confidence and threats to social security, political stability, economic prosperity and other serious negative effects. From this point of view, this study will address the corruption of sports in the field of football, which many sports institutions and bodies consider to be the biggest source of corruption because of its global popularity and revenues, as well as the mechanisms to combat it from the point of view of specialists, represented by professors and university doctors specialized in the field of sports in general and in football in particular.
